The **SCALA programme** responds to the urgent need for transformative mitigation and adaptation action in the agriculture and land use sectors to address food security, climate and environment challenges.

Jointly coordinated by FAO and UNDP, SCALA addresses information, governance, and financial barriers countries face in the implementation of their agriculture and land use goals under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

SCALA supports **12 partner countries**, Argentina, Cambodia, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cote d'Ivoire, Egypt, Ethiopia, Mongolia, Nepal, Senegal, Thailand, and Uganda to:

- ▶ Utilize systems-level assessments to improve understanding of climate options with transformative potential and foster links to **Sustainable Development Goals**.
- ▶ Achieve impact in such areas as **private sector engagement** in climate action, whole-of-government coordination, monitoring, and digital innovation.
- ▶ Catalyze partnerships to achieve cross-sectoral, **gender-responsive** and inclusive planning to benefit the most vulnerable natural resource-dependent communities.
