## EXPECTED OUTPUTS

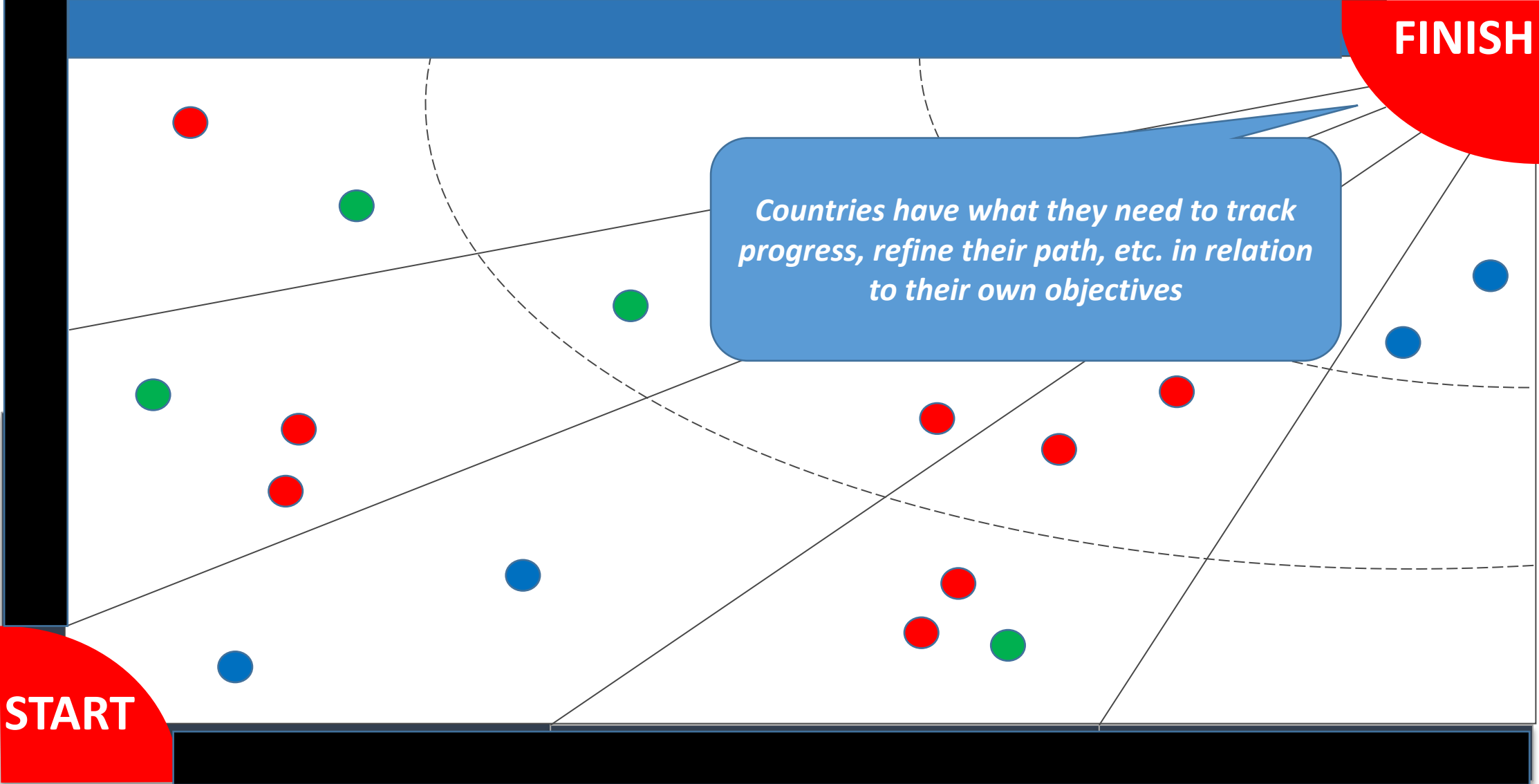
1. A revised roadmap for the Rome Promise;
