3. The Joint Meeting thanked the Director-General for his comprehensive statement and appreciated his leadership of the Organization.

I. Adoption of the Provisional Agenda

4. The Joint Meeting adopted the Provisional Agenda for the Session.

II. Programme Implementation Report 2022-23

- 5. The Joint Meeting <u>welcomed</u> the Programme Implementation Report (PIR) 2022-23, and particularly <u>appreciated</u> the presentation of the document.
- 6. The Joint Meeting:
 - a) <u>commended</u> FAO's approach to assist Members in addressing the overlapping global crises in 2022-23;
 - appreciated the support of the Organization to Members to fulfil the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, in line with commitments in the Programme of Work and Budget 2022-23 and subsequent adjustments, as presented in the main document and its Annexes;
 - c) requested Management to apply a similar approach to reporting, as was done for the Strategies on Climate Change and Science and Innovation, on the results of major Strategies in future editions of the PIR, including the FAO Strategy on Mainstreaming Biodiversity across Agricultural Sectors;
 - d) <u>underlined</u> the need to ensure that supporting functions of the Organization are adequately resourced and <u>requested</u> a more transparent reporting on how the additional cost recovery is distributed to meet these needs;

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e) <u>commended</u> FAO's resource mobilization efforts, reaching the notable level of USD 4.2 billion;

- f) <u>encouraged</u> FAO to continue advancing science- and evidence- based normative and standard setting work, including by supporting Codex Alimentarius, and the International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) along with its ePhyto solution;
- g) <u>requested</u> more information in the next PIR on how the Organization has been supporting the implementation of the UN Decade of Family Farming in the last biennium;
- encouraged the Organization to capture both successful and unsuccessful efforts at addressing operational challenges in its reporting on lessons learned, to better inform organizational decisions;
- i) noted the financial performance as illustrated in Annex 2, <u>called upon</u> FAO to facilitate, in sessions of the Joint Meeting, as relevant, further inclusive discussions on this issue, including updated and transparent information on the application of voluntary contributions; and
- j) <u>recommended</u> the endorsement by the Council of the Programme Implementation Report 2022-23.

III. FAO Country Office Network-Current Status and Way Forward

7. The Joint Meeting:

- a) welcomed the Reports of the Regional Conferences in 2024 on the Country Office Network;
- b) <u>expressed</u> support for the principles outlined to support more efficient and effective delivery of FAO's work at country level;
- c) <u>encouraged</u> Management to proceed with inclusive, effective, transparent and iterative consultations with Member countries on this topic; and
- d) <u>encouraged</u> Management to provide formal and informal updates and additional information to Members and <u>looked forward</u> to further discussions and guidance on this important matter from successive Governing Body sessions.
