## WHAT CAN THE OMBUDS DO FOR YOU?

The Ombuds helps FAO personnel to address their workplace concerns and resolve conflicts through informal means. The Ombuds will listen to your concerns and assist you through:

- Conflict coaching Strengthening your ability and confidence to take the next step.
- ▶ Shuttle diplomacy With the consent of both parties, negotiating between the parties to assist in reaching an informal resolution.
- Review of options Helping to develop options to address the issue(s) and assessing the consequences of these options.
- Providing information Sharing guidance and clarification on procedures, rules and practices at FAO.
- Referral Identifying other entities that may be able to provide assistance.
- Training Conducting capacity development exercises.
- Outreach Providing information and presentations to staff and managers

### **OMBUDS GUIDING PRINCIPLES**

**Informality.** The Ombuds Office is not an office of record and does not take part in any formal process.

Neutrality. The Ombuds does not take sides.

**Impartiality** The Ombuds works to ensure processes are fair.

**Confidentiality.** All communications are private and strictly confidential.

Independence. The Ombuds Office is independent of all other offices in FAO and has direct access to the Director-General.
