### Hunger Hotspots – FAO-WFP early warnings on acute food insecurity: June to September 2022 Outlook

The latest report finds that – alongside conflict – frequent and recurring climate shocks continue to drive acute hunger. It also warns that climatic trends linked to La Niña since late 2020 are expected to continue through 2022, driving up humanitarian needs and acute hunger.

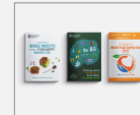

### FAO Food Price Index

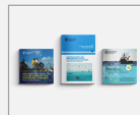
The index tracks monthly changes in the international prices of commonly traded food commodities. It averaged 157.4 points in May 2022. This is a modest decline (0.6 percent) from April, but still 22.8 percent above its value in the corresponding month of last year.

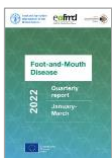
