Item 17.2: Annual Report of the WFP Executive Board on its activities in 2020

WFP takes this opportunity to thank Australia for the comments shared and its acknowledgement of the organization's achievements. WFP has noted the points raised on funding, particularly comments related to low levels of flexible funding. WFP continues to advocate for multi-year and flexible funding while recognizing the value of all contributions, particularly sources of more sustainable financing.

On the inclusion of disaggregated data and renewed request for better quality information on vulnerabilities, including disabilities, WFP would like to extend its gratitude to the Government of Australia for its continued support and advocacy on issues related to disability inclusion. The new Corporate Results Framework 2022-2025 includes indicators on disability inclusion, which are cross-cutting and mandatory under protection and Accountability to Affected Populations (AAP), and also aligned with three Quadrennial comprehensive policy review (QCPR) indicators on disability inclusion.
