ACHIVEMENTS



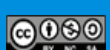
- Hired consultant to develop a watershed management plan that will be used to advise on key management and conservation activities of the watershed and other natural resources at the project sites.

- Planted 5 000 seedlings in the degraded forest areas in Kiang East.
