ANIMAL PRODUCTION AND HEALTH



Options for low emission development in the Sri Lanka dairy sector

This study identifies low-cost strategies (e.g. strategic feeding and supplementation with fodder trees) to reduce enteric methane emissions from milk production, while contributing to the country's short- to long-term social and economic development. Report of the 42nd General Session of the European Commission for the control of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (EuFMD)

The report provides an overview of the FMD situation in the past two years and current high risks to EuFMD Member States, including unexplained jumps of infection and economic consequences of FMD outbreaks. New outbreaks and re-emergence have been identified in South Asia and the Near East. (148 pp.) FAO & EuFMD



Options for low-emission development in the Kenya dairy sector

This study evaluates the potential for improving milk production while reducing enteric methane emission through low-cost strategies, including the use of urea-treated crop residues and vaccination against East Coast Fever. (46 pp.) FAO & New Zealand Agricultural Greenhouse Gas Research Centre

CLIMATE CHANGE



Ex-Ante Carbon-balance Tool for Value Chain (EX-ACT VC)

This publication explains the methodology of the FAO EX-ACT Value Chain Tool, which includes eight modules (e.g. land-use change, production practices, processing) for analysing crops, livestock, fisheries and aquaculture production and increasing profitability and environmental performance. ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT



Forced migration and protracted crises: a multilayered approach

This guidance note describes the challenges of livelihood interventions in protracted crises and proposes future steps: designing shock-responsive social protection systems, promoting social inclusion, or maximizing economic opportunities for migrants. (32pp.)

Parliamentary fronts against hunger and legislative initiatives for the right to adequate food and nutrition

A summary of the most significant legislative results achieved on food security and nutrition, school meals, and family farming in Latin America. It includes lessons learned, an overview of mechanisms that have proved useful and an annex with detailed information on 15 regional laws from parliamentary front initiatives. Sowing the seeds of peace for food security

This study looks at the causal relationship by which conflict triggers food crises and food insecurity (e.g. by disrupting distribution networks), which in turn perpetuate violence. It proposes intervention mechanisms, including regular cash transfers, for improving food security and sustaining peace. (116 pp.) FAO Agricultural Development Economics Technical Study

[Global Early Warning – Early Action Report on Food Security and Agriculture](#)

This forward-looking report highlights major disaster risks to food security and agriculture from October to December 2017, including the risk of famine in Yemen and displacement in Myanmar. The report provides early action recommendations for each risk (e.g. income generation, food provision). (32 pp.)

The Committee took stock of progress made with regard to curbing IUU fishing and adopted the work plan for 2017–19, which includes facilitating the use of vessel identifiers and organizing training for inspectors.

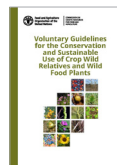
GENDER

This publication identifies practices to achieve harmonization between progressive Mozambican legislation and customary justice systems with regard to gender equality and land resources. Suggestions include training of paralegals and gathering information on community courts. (60 pp.) FAO Legal Papers

PLANT PRODUCTION AND HEALTH



Voluntary Guidelines for the Conservation and Sustainable Use of Crop Wild Relatives and Wild Food Plants

The publication presents an overview of these plant genetic resources, including their human and environmental benefits and the threats they face (e.g. natural disasters). It provides recommendations for implementing a national conservation plan, ranging from inventorying the target species to conducting threat assessments.
