<p>Japan Friday, 20 September 10:45AM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Japan thanks the Secretariat for the report on the implementation of the recommendations of the 28th Session of the Committee on Agriculture published in COAG/2024/3. We acknowledged the progress of FAO’s work in various areas towards achieving the 2030 Agenda. • We appreciate FAO’s work regarding the progress of FAO's Action Plan on AMR (2021-2025). Since continuous efforts are crucial in addressing AMR, we look forward to the ongoing implementation of these efforts. • Regarding UN Decade of Family Farming 2019-2028 (UNDFE), Japan would like to highlight the relationship between family farming and GIAHS. We highly appreciate that FAO organized “the International Symposium on GIAHS and Family Farming” in 2022 and 2023, as well as “the Workshop on Traditional Knowledge and Innovation in GIAHS 2024”. We consider these initiatives valuable in that they focus on the role of Family Farming in building a sustainable agrifood system from the perspective of GIAHS. These initiatives on the UNDFE and GIAHS were also mentioned in paragraph 65 of the Secretary-General’s report for UN General Assembly, “Implementation of the United Nations Decade of Family Farming (2019–2028)”, published in July 2023, (A/78/233). Japan requests FAO to continue such efforts and play a leading role in the implementation of the UNDFE. • The sustainable use and management of plastics in agriculture is an emergent global issue of importance, and the agricultural sector must actively address this. Japan highly commends the development of the Voluntary Code of Conduct on the Sustainable Use and Management of Plastics in Agriculture (VCoC), in accordance with the COAG 28 recommendation, through active participation of various member countries and technical experts, as this VCoC provides flexible and practical principles, actions and measures in a well-balanced manner tailored to the circumstances of each region and country. Japan expects its adoption at COAG 29 and believes it is crucial for each country to voluntarily takes actions and measures guided by the VCoC.
