EXPECTED RESULTS



- Youth and women empowerment and development.
- Modernize agriculture, agribusiness and fisheries.
- Human capital development health (nutrition) and social protection.
- To support Forest and Farm Producer Organizations (FFPOs) by ensuring that they are the primary agents for climate-resilient landscapes and improved livelihoods.

ACHIEVEMENTS



- Twenty-five members, including eight females, of Forest and Farm Producer Organizations, trained on Organizational Group Management modules.
- Forty women and youth representatives within FFPOs trained on Market Analysis and Development (MA&D) Approach.
- Five Business plans developed by trained women and youth in the five Regions focusing on beekeeping, Tree Nursery Management and incense making.
- Twenty – Five Agriculture and Natural Resources (ANR) extension agents and executive members of Apex FFPOs trained on Forest Business Incubation (FBI) Tool Kits developed by FAO & Partners.
- Peer mentoring support provided to five women vegetable producers in the five Regions in rapid compost making and value addition techniques for perishable vegetable products.
- Study on finance accessibility for small collective business conducted and results shared with 20 FFPO members
- Strategic Plan of the All Gambia Forestry Platform (AGFP) reviewed and updated; Strategic Plan 2021- 2025 developed and attended by 25 participants.
- Forty-Five FFPOs participated in the review of Forest Policy 2010- 2019 and the development of Forest Policy 2021- 2030.
