Since 2010, the Benefit-sharing Fund supported projects in **67 developing countries**. In collaboration with over **500 institutions**, the programme nurtures diverse approaches to encourage sustainable agriculture and improve food and nutrition security.

To date, farmers tested over **30 000 genetic materials** to match preferences and respond to needs and challenges in diverse agro-ecological settings.



Researchers expanded their knowledge and techniques. Jointly with farmers they developed at least **400 climate-resilient crop varieties**.



Almost 94 000 working with plant genetic resources increased know-how and skills on conservation, management and policy engagement



Lessons learned and best practices at local level informed policy makers in their **national and regional planning** on plant genetic resources for food and agriculture.
